Public Hearing

The Housing Authority of the City of Cumberland has determined that an amendment is necessary to our 5-year PHA Plan to add the Housing Authority of Allegany County properties and operations, which were transferred on April 1, 2019 by HUD, into our authority operations.

The amendment is available for review for the next 45 days at the Central Office located at 635 E. First Street, Cumberland during normal business hours.

In addition, a Public Hearing will be held on July 12, 2019 at 10:00 AM, at the Jane Frazier Village Community Room connected to our main Office.

RAD UPDATE

The Housing Authority of the City of Cumberland was granted approval by HUD on January 10, 2017 to begin the conversion of our Public Housing program to a new HUD program called the Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) project. The new program continues to provide the same affordable housing qualifications but funded under the Project Based Rental Assistance which is more stable. Under the new program, the Housing Authority will become the owner of the property instead of HUD through a Limited Partnership and will continue to manage the property under HUD guidelines. The big advantage of the new program is that we would then be eligible to borrow funds (which we are not currently permitted to do) to be used to modernize and improve the appearance of our developments inside and out.

We experienced a delay in the process due to the necessity of reorganizing our development team to be more efficient. The team now includes: the Cumberland Housing Group as the sole developer; Belt Construction Group as the contractor; EADS Architects performing the design and East Hills Engineering as the engineering consultant. We have worked with this team for over 25 years and are very confident in all partners.

Fort Cumberland Homes was identified as the development most needing physical improvements and therefore has always been our starting point. On May 10th, we finally submitted our 1,494-page application to the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development for review. It will take several months before we know anything further. If funded, we will be conducting a tenant meeting at Fort Cumberland to educate the residents there on what will be done, when it will occur and how it will proceed. At this time, we do not expect construction to begin for <u>at least</u> six months and then it would be on the current empty units. As we know more information, we will keep the residents of Fort Cumberland Homes advised and you will definitely be advised at least 90 days in advance of any direct impact to your unit.

Beginning May 31, 2019, our team will concentrate our efforts on John F. Kennedy Homes as it was determined to be the second development most needing rehabilitation. Some work was previously completed and we will be picking up from there. Since this work is still under design and based upon the requirements needed for submission, we are at least a year away from any construction.

Notice to Cumberland Housing Residents

Public Awareness Program Message Natural Gas Safety Instructions

Natural gas for your appliances is delivered through a jurisdictional natural gas pipeline system. The system is a safe, reliable and efficient way to deliver natural gas for your heating, water heating, cooking, and clothes drying needs. Although safe, tested and regulated, the system's most common hazard is from 3rd party damage from excavation. Before digging or excavations are done, contact Miss Utility at 1-800-257-7777 or 811 and call Cumberland Housing at 301-724-2055. Please read the following safety information:

Natural gas, like all forms of energy and like many other products found in the home, is capable of doing damage and <u>MUST</u> be used properly. Here are some facts everyone should know about gas and gas operated equipment:

Gas Accidents can be avoided when you follow these safety rules:

- 1. Teach children that they are not to turn on or light appliances
- 2. Keep combustibles (curtains, paper, and fluids) away from any open flames.
- 3. If lighting is required always light match first and hold it at point of lighting before you turn on gas.
- 4. Keep burning surface clean of dirt, match ends, grease, etc.
- 5. Repair and installation is a job for experts. Never attempt to do it yourself.
- 6. Use equipment for the job it was intended to do for example, an oven should NOT be used to heat a room.

Your senses can help you to discover a gas leak.....

- ><u>SMELL</u>: A distinctive odor has been added to natural gas so that less than 1% of gas in the air can be detected.
- ><u>SIGHT:</u> In some appliances you can see the flame so you know it is working.
- ><u>TOUCH:</u> With some appliances you can feel overheating or cold in the burner area which would indicate trouble.
- > <u>HEARING:</u> If the flame sounds unusually noisy, it may not be burning properly.

If you smell gas:

- 1. NO FLAMES OR SPARKS! Immediately put out all smoking materials and pre-existing open flames. Do not operate lights, appliances, telephones or cell phones. Flames or sparks from these sources can trigger an explosion or fire.
- 2. LEAVE THE AREA IMMEDIATELY Get everyone out of the building or area where you suspect gas is leaking.
- 3. REPORT THE LEAK From a neighbor's home or other nearby building away from the gas leak, call your natural gas supplier right away. If you are unable to reach your natural gas supplier, call 911 or your local fire department.
- 4. DO NOT RETURN TO THE BUILDING OR AREA Until your natural gas supplier determines that it is safe to do so.
- 5. GET YOUR SYSTEM CHECKED Before you attempt to use any of your natural gas appliances, your natural gas supplier or a qualified service technician must check your entire system to ensure that it is leak free.
