Preventive Maintenance Inspections

As a reminder, a copy of the Inspection will be left in your unit for your information. If any repairs need to be done, maintenance will be returning within 30 days to complete the repairs. Entry is **Mandatory** in order to do Inspections as well as repairs. Please continue to call the Maintenance Department (301)724-2055 with any deficiencies even if your inspection is scheduled in the near future.

Medical Marijuana

Any form of Marijuana, including gummies, pills, etc., is not allowed on any Federally assisted property, as this is a **Schedule 1** controlled substance and illegal under Federal Law. The use of Medical Marijuana is prohibited by Federal Law on all properties or in your unit.

If evidence is found that **any form of use or possession of Medical Marijuana**, on the property, violators will be issued a notice to vacate.

As a reminder there is to be **NO SMOKING** in the building, in your apartment or outside. This includes e-cigarettes as well. You must be 25 feet off the property to smoke or you may smoke in the designated smoking area.

Jane Frazier Residents

The Salvation Army has asked that you inform your children not to take any furniture to the field behind their building to play with. Furthermore, the property line is shared with residential houses and Mountain View Apartments. Salvation Army and the other property owners do not mind the children playing in the area, but do not want them bringing furniture on to the property and leaving it behind.

Christmas Assistance nelpful things to know in 2024

Applications for assistance are limited to one agency per child.

- Toys For Happiness only list children you are applying for. (Up to age I4)
- . Toys For Tots (Allegany County) only list children you are applying for (ages 14-17)
- The Salvation Army ALL household members must be listed. (There is a separate section for older children who do not qualify)

If applying at multiple agencies due to age limits, you must indicate on your application that you are seeking help for unqualified children with another agency. There may be other agencies not listed above, but this applies to all Christmas Assistance.

After you've applied....

We hear it a lot, "I didn't hear back from ___ Agency, so I applied elsewhere because I was worried." Most agencies have ONE person processing and reviewing hundreds of applications. It's likely an applicant won't hear something right away. Be patient before applying elsewhere! It is always okay to call and check to see that your application was received!

Deadlines are important...

Oftentimes, the person reviewing applications is also the person coordinating collection of items and distribution - it is important to have a deadline for applications, so the other work can begin!

Methods of Communication...

Toys 4 Happiness - mails out postcards closer to the date of distribution (calls if denied) Toys For Tots-phone call

The Salvation Army - Email for initial acceptance or decline, phone call and letter for decline (You may receive a denial call AFTER an initial approval email for applying for more than one place for a child!)
